ACE HOTEL

This borough isn't something you "do" so much as something you get pulled into. And the blocks surrounding Ace Hotel Brooklyn are just a taste of what this borough does best. One minute you're waiting under the glow of the Brooklyn Paramount marquee, the next you're sprawled out in Prospect Park's Long Meadow watching the sunrise, arguing about the best scallion pancake breakfast sandwich in Williamsburg.

This guide follows that same energy. A little chaotic, weirdly specific, entirely word-of-mouth. Built with the Perfectly Imperfect community, it maps the places people actually return to, from bowling alleys and Bushwick bar crawls to bookstores you lose hours in and bakeries you can WFH all day.



This guide, just like Brooklyn, is forever! Scan the QR, add your own spot, pass it on.

Note: All walking distances and transit directions are calculated from Ace Hotel Brooklyn (252 Schermerhorn St)

Arts & Media

BROOKLYN PARAMOUNT



WALK: ~0.2 MI / 4 MIN

LOCAL TIP: Grab cheesecake at Junior's across the street before the show. Arrive early to take in the restored 1928 interior and the vintage Wurlitzer organ.

IDENTITY: For the music-lover chasing gilded-age grandeur.

FILM NOIR CINEMA (GREENPOINT)

TRANSIT: G TRAIN FROM HOYT-SCHERMERHORN → NASSAU AV (~25 MIN), 5-MIN WALK

LOCAL TIP: Cash only. Check what owner Will is screening. Programming leans obscure, foreign, cult, and noir. The DVD-for-sale wall is a rabbit hole; \$5 beers sweeten it.

IDENTITY: For the cinephile.

BROOKLYN MUSEUM

TRANSIT: 2 OR 3 TRAIN FROM NEVINS ST → EASTERN PKWY-BROOKLYN MUSEUM (~15 MIN)

LOCAL TIP: Come on First Saturdays (except September) for free evening admission, live DJs, and a genuine party. Don't miss the 5th-floor Luce Center "open storage" vaults.

IDENTITY: For a Met-level collection without Midtown crowds.



BRIC ARTS MEDIA

WALK: ~0.3 MI / 5 MIN

LOCAL TIP: Gallery admission is free. In summer, follow BRIC to Prospect Park for their outdoor concert series, BRIC Celebrate Brooklyn!

IDENTITY: For the civic-minded culture-seeker.

Cafes

WIN SON BAKERY

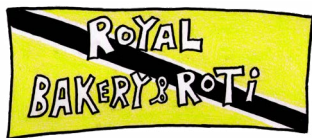
WALK: ~2.5 MI / 50 MIN
TRANSIT: G TRAIN FROM HOYT-SCHERMERHORN → METROPOLITAN AV (~20 MIN), 10-MIN WALK; OR L TO GRAND

LOCAL TIP: Order the BEC scallion pancake sandwich or the Fan Tuan (Taiwanese rice roll). Go weekday mornings as weekends have a serious line.

IDENTITY: For the foodie.

ROYAL BAKERY (CROWN HEIGHTS)

WALK: ~2.3 MI / 45 MIN
TRANSIT: A OR C FROM HOYT-SCHERMERHORN → NOSTRAND AV, ~10-MIN WALK (~25 MIN TOTAL)



LOCAL TIP: Get the doubles (Trinidadian curried-chickpea flatbread). Ask for "slight pepper" if you don't want it too hot. Closed Mon & Sun.

IDENTITY: For the traveler who knows Brooklyn for its Caribbean culture.

ALLIGATOR LOUNGE (WILLIAMSBURG)

TRANSIT: G TRAIN FROM HOYT-SCHERMERHORN → METROPOLITAN AV (~20 MIN)



LOCAL TIP: Every drink comes with a ticket for a free personal pizza made in-house. Stay for karaoke in the back — free to sing, no cover.

IDENTITY: For the dive-bar enthusiast.

SUNNY'S BAR (RED HOOK)

TRANSIT: B61 BUS FROM DOWNTOWN BROOKLYN ~25-30 MIN, OR F/G TO SMITH-9TH STS + 15-MIN WALK

LOCAL TIP: Cash only (ATM on site). Go Saturday night for the legendary bluegrass jam — old salts bringing instruments, no cover.

IDENTITY: For the music-lover after old Brooklyn soul.

Dining

TINA'S PLACE ('TINA'S DINER', EAST WILLIAMSBURG)

TRANSIT: J OR M FROM HOYT-SCHERMERHORN (VIA A/C) → FLUSHING AV (~25 MIN), SHORT WALK

LOCAL TIP: Cash only (ATM inside). Order big — portions are huge, prices are low. The huevos rancheros and pancakes are the move. Open 6 AM for post-bar or early-morning runs.

IDENTITY: For the no-frills breakfast loyalist.

SWOONY'S (COLUMBIA WATERFRONT)

WALK: ~1.3 MI / 25 MIN (PLEASANT WALK THROUGH COBBLE HILL)

LOCAL TIP: Order the lobster orzo — every review mentions it for a reason. Reserve ahead; it's a small room. Closed Sunday.

IDENTITY: For the date-night diner who wants an intimate setting.

BABY BLUES LUNCHEONETTE (EAST WILLIAMSBURG)

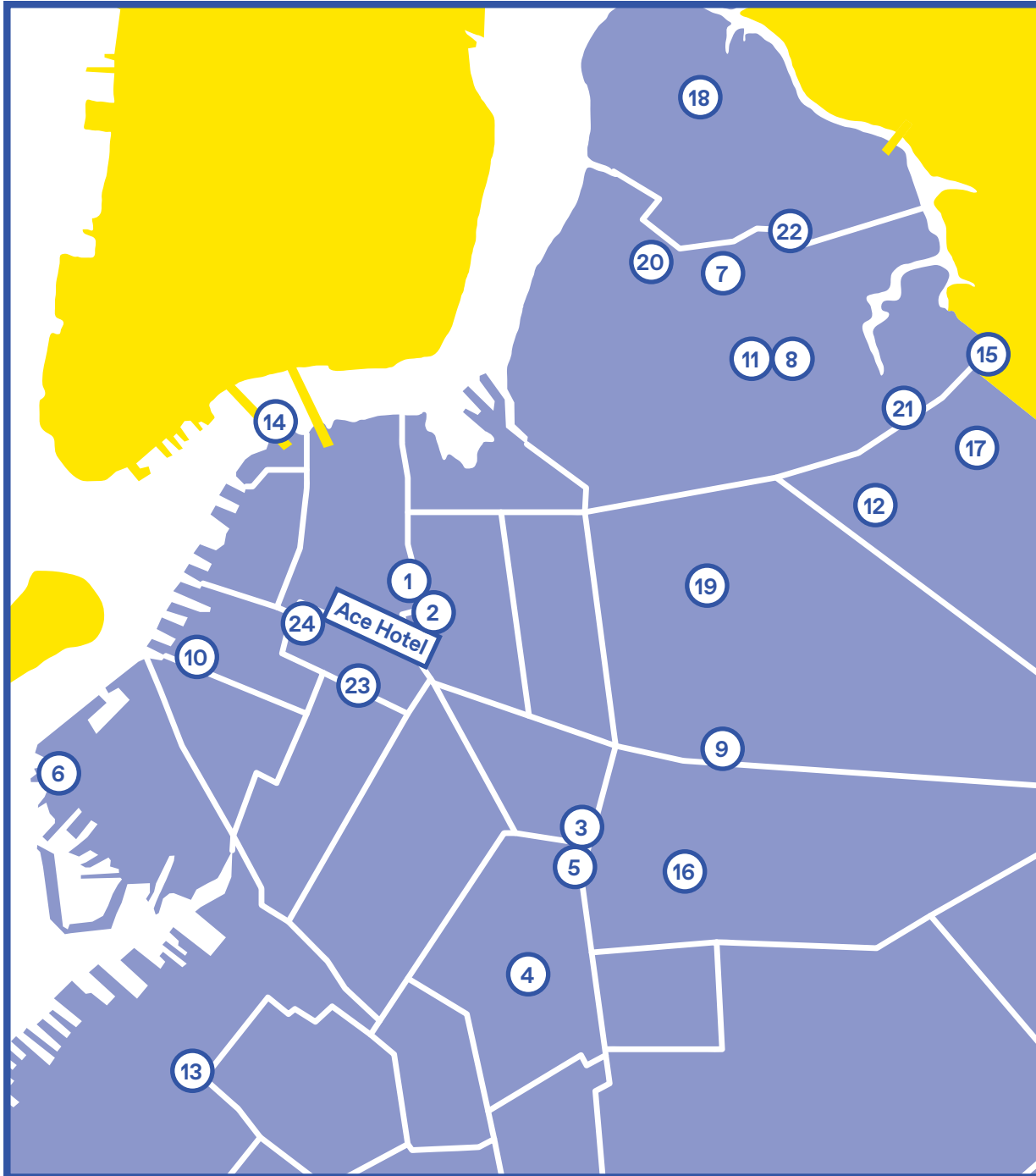
WALK: ~2.3 MI / 45 MIN
TRANSIT: G FROM HOYT-SCHERMERHORN → BROADWAY (~20 MIN), 5-MIN WALK



LOCAL TIP: Order the baklava banana waffles or the Zorba plate. Tiny space — aim for a weekday to avoid the Saturday-noon crunch.

IDENTITY: For the brunch-hunter with a soft spot for Greek-diner nostalgia.

Entertainment

PARAGON (BUSHWICK)

TRANSIT: J/M/Z FROM HOYT-SCHERMERHORN (TRANSFER TO A/C FIRST AT HOYT) → MYRTLE AV (~25 MIN). OR LATE-NIGHT CARS



LOCAL TIP: Only open Fri & Sat, 9:30 PM–3 AM. This is a real techno club, not a casual cocktail spot. Go late, dress to dance, check the lineup first.

IDENTITY: For the underground-dance devotee.

MELODY LANES (SUNSET PARK)

TRANSIT: D/N/R FROM ATLANTIC AV-BARCLAYS → 36TH ST OR 25TH ST (~20 MIN), SHORT WALK



LOCAL TIP: Every Tuesday is ladies' night with discounted lanes and shoe rental if you are on a girls' trip!

IDENTITY: For the traveler who wants to live like a true local.

PUBLIC RECORDS (GOWANUS)

WALK: ~0.6 MI / 12 MIN

LOCAL TIP: Three venues in one: plant-based café (daytime), the Sound Room upstairs (cocktail lounge with audiophile speakers), and the basement dance floor (house/techno on weekends). Check what's playing; it's a booking-driven spot.

IDENTITY: For the design-minded person who knows what "hi-fi" actually means.

Shopping

ATLANTIC AVENUE SHOPS

WALK: THE STRIP STARTS 5 MIN FROM THE HOTEL AND RUNS WEST TOWARD THE WATER

LOCAL TIP: The good stretch is Court St to Hicks St. Hit Horseman Antiques, Sahadi's (legendary Lebanese grocer for olives, bulk spices, baklava), Outline, and the vintage boutiques. Saturday mid-morning has the best vibe.

IDENTITY: For the slow-browser who likes a shopping street.

HAROLD AND MAUDE VINTAGE (BED-STUY)

WALK: ~1.8 MI / 35 MIN

TRANSIT: C TRAIN FROM HOYT-SCHERMERHORN → CLINTON-WASHINGTON AVS (~12 MIN), 10-MIN WALK



LOCAL TIP: Best hunting ground for leather jackets and cashmere sweaters at honest prices. Closed Tuesdays. Small shop — chat with the owner; he'll pull things from the back.

IDENTITY: For the thoughtful vintage shopper.

VENUS IN TOKYO (WILLIAMSBURG)

TRANSIT: L FROM UNION SQ (VIA 2/3 FROM HOYT-SCHERMERHORN) → BEDFORD AV, 7-MIN WALK (~25 MIN). OR G TO METROPOLITAN AV

LOCAL TIP: Everything — jewelry, handmade garments, tiny weird trinkets — is independently designed and artist-made. Go in without a list; you'll leave with something you didn't know existed.

IDENTITY: For the maximalist who dresses like a character.

Parks

BROOKLYN BOTANIC GARDEN

TRANSIT: 2 OR 3 TRAIN FROM NEVINS ST → EASTERN PKWY-BROOKLYN MUSEUM (~15 MIN)

LOCAL TIP: Time your visit to Weekends in Bloom (early May) for peak cherry blossoms. Closed Mondays. The Japanese Hill-and-Pond Garden is the crown jewel.

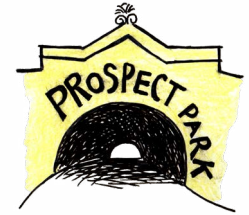
IDENTITY: For the romantic photographer.

PROSPECT PARK

TRANSIT: 2 OR 3 TRAINS FROM NEVINS ST → GRAND ARMY PLAZA (~15 MIN)

LOCAL TIP: Enter at Grand Army Plaza and head straight to Long Meadow for a picnic. In summer, check the Lakeside splash pad; in winter, LeFrak Center for ice skating.

IDENTITY: For the traveler who wants to live like a Brooklynite for an afternoon.



Views

EAST RIVER FERRY (FULTON FERRY LANDING)

WALK: ~1.1 MI / 22 MIN (WALK THROUGH DUMBO)

TRANSIT: A/C FROM HOYT-SCHERMERHORN → HIGH ST, 8-MIN WALK (~15 MIN)



LOCAL TIP: Take the South Brooklyn route at sunset, \$4.50, full bar onboard, and the rooftop deck gives you the Statue of Liberty, Brooklyn Bridge, and Manhattan skyline in one shot. OMNY won't work, so pay via app or kiosk.

IDENTITY: For the budget traveler who wants the best skyline view in NYC.

BUSHWICK COLLECTIVE STREET ART

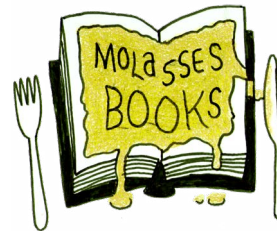
TRANSIT: L TRAIN FROM UNION SQ (AFTER 2/3 FROM HOYT-SCHERMERHORN) → JEFFERSON ST (~30 MIN TOTAL). OR THE M TRAIN TO CENTRAL AV

LOCAL TIP: Start at Troutman St & St. Nicholas Avenue and walk east, murals change constantly. Saturday afternoons are the best window. Go during daylight.

IDENTITY: For the urban photographer and street-art pilgrim.

Bookshops

MOLASSES BOOKS (BUSHWICK)



TRANSIT: L TRAIN FROM UNION SQ (VIA 2/3 FROM HOYT-SCHERMERHORN) → HALSEY ST (~30 MIN), 5-MIN WALK. OR M TO CENTRAL AV

LOCAL TIP: It's a used bookstore, café, AND a wine bar where you can trade books for store credit. Grab a coffee or natural wine and stay for hours.

IDENTITY: For the bookish wanderer who likes their third place slightly feral.

THE NONBINARIAN BOOKSTORE (CROWN HEIGHTS)

TRANSIT: 2 OR 3 FROM NEVINS ST → FRANKLIN AV, 10-MIN WALK (~20 MIN)

LOCAL TIP: Grab a free mystery book outside with a purchase. Follow their Instagram — they host small community events, readings, and zine fairs.

IDENTITY: For the queer traveler looking for a welcoming neighborhood anchor.

Brooklyn doesn't end. There's always another block, another spot, another reason to come back. Whether you're here for a work trip, a weekend, or quietly deciding if this is where you belong, this borough will keep surprising you.
